DAY 1	FRIDAY, 4th May 2012	MT - D
7.30 am.	Depart Kings Depot, 6 Lingard Street, Merewether, or you may care to join the coach at Charlestown, Belmont, Swansea or Doyalson.	
9.45 am.	Morning Tea and comfort stop at Glenbrook Visitors Centre before we begin our Blue Mountains journey.	
10.30 am	Following our break we continue on up the Great Western Highway passing through the small historic villages that were once the popular holiday destinations of Sydney's rich and famous business owners.	

A visit to the lookout at Wentworth Falls will allow you your first magic views out over the Jamieson Valley.

Then it is off to Leuralla at Leura. A collector's paradise and garden lovers delight. There will be something to thrill everyone.

Leuralla is home to the unique combination of a world class collection of toys and model trains dating from 1910 to 1960. The historic early 1900's house is located in one of the most scenic locations and is surrounded with extensive gardens that will be a blaze of autumn colours during this visit.

The heritage village of Leura is our lunch time stop. The mall is like a magnet for tourists – chocolate and lolly shops – craft galleries – boutique clothing and gift shops and cafés and coffee shops.



After spending time in Leura we shall continue on with our sightseeing around the main scenic areas of Katoomba. A magnificent view of the mountains and valleys can be seen from Sublime Point Lookout – Cliff Drive and Echo Point. The famous Three Sisters being one of the most photographed features in the area.

Katoomba is the principal town in the Blue Mountains with a population of just over 8,000 local residents. It is also one of the most popular towns for holiday folk and day tourists who are visiting from overseas. There will be time for you to take a stroll down the main street before we travel onto Blackheath.

5.00 pm Check into the Resort for a relaxing two night stay. Enjoy a swim or pre-dinner drinks.

6.30 pm Buffet dinner in the Resort Restaurant.

DAY 2 SATURDAY, 5th May 2012 B- L – D

7.30 am. Buffet breakfast in the Resort Restaurant.

8.45 am. Depart the Resort for another day exploring the Blue Mountains. The town of Blackheath is surrounded mostly with natural scenery in contrast to the historic features and commercial tourist attractions of the other Blue Mountain towns.

The south side of the Great Western Highway looks over the Megalong Valley and Govetts Leap and Evans Lookout both provide superb views across the Grose Valley.

We shall make a short stop at the National Park Heritage Centre before travelling back to Katoomba for a visit to The Edge Cinema for the 10.20 am screening of the Edge experience film on the big screen.



Our main feature of the day will be time spent at Scenic World where you will descend into the valley on the Scenic Railway. Take time to walk along the rainforest walkway and the return to the

top via the Scenic Cableway. The Scenic World Souvenir shop will tempt you before we make our way into the Skyway Revolving Restaurant for a Buffet Lunch (all you can eat). The view is just stunning.

The rest of the afternoon will be completed with some extra local sightseeing returning to the Resort around 4.00 pm. This will allow time for you to relax, utilize the resort facilities or take a walk around Blackheath Town Centre and parks. (The Golf Club is directly opposite the Resort.)

6.30 pm Dinner in the Resort Restaurant.



DAY 3 **SUNDAY, 6th May 2012**

Last chance to look around the Resort and enjoy the facilities.

7.30 am. Breakfast in the Resort Restaurant.

8.30 am. Depart the Resort and travel to Mount Victoria and across the scenic Bell Line of Road. As we make our way down through the towns and villages of the Hawkesbury Valley there are magnificent views to be

seen across the valley and back over the rugged sandstone cliffs of the Blue Mountains.

A morning tea / comfort stop will be made at the Bilpen Fruit Barn.

This stop will give you the opportunity to purchase local area new season apples.

There will be time for you to browse the Sunday Craft Markets in the Mall and purchase some lunch before leaving Windsor for the return travel to Newcastle.
